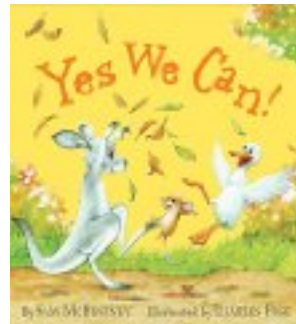

Yes We Can!

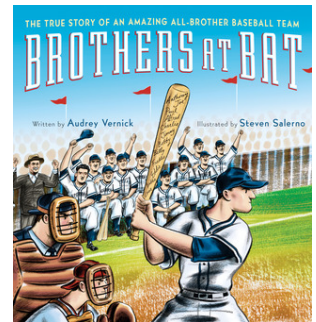
In this cute story, three friends learn how individual talents can still lead to great teamwork!

Brothers at Bat

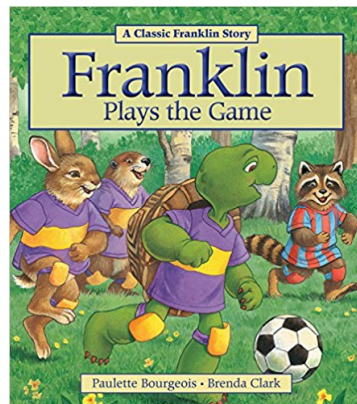
A true story about a family of 16 who form a baseball team and learn the true value of teamwork.

Franklin Plays the Game

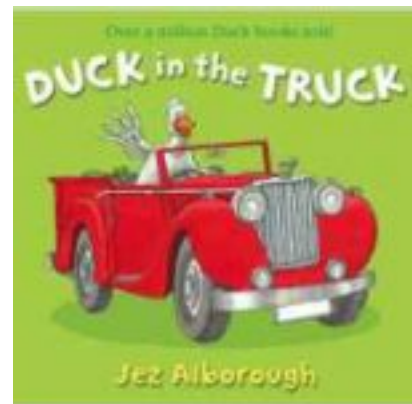
This classic storybook character works hard to be the best player on his team. Is that really being a team player?

Duck in the Truck

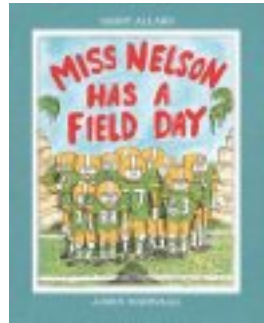
One of my children's all time favorite stories. Duck gets stuck and it will take teamwork to get him unstuck!

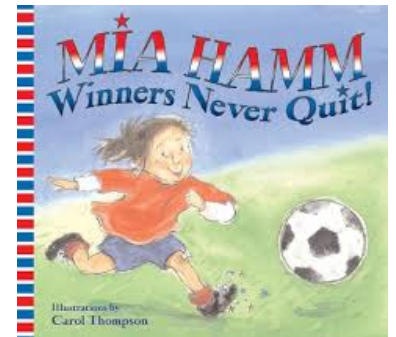
In this classic story, Miss Nelson needs to whip a football team into shape. Will they work together as a team?

The Biggest Snowman Ever

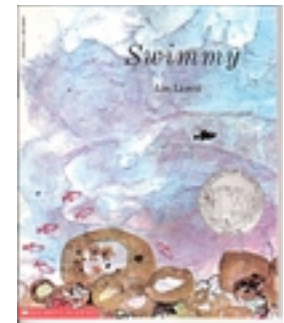
In this lovable story, a group of kids learn it is better to work as a team to create the best snowman ever!

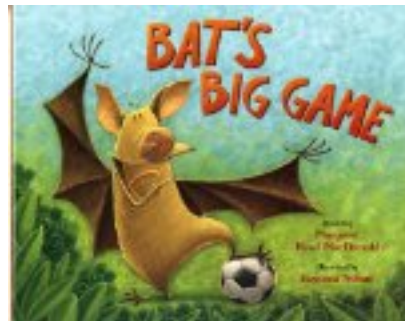
Swimmy shows his friends how—with ingenuity and team work—they can overcome any danger.
